EXECUTIVE SUMMARY AND CHAIR REPORT FROM THE APRIL 8, 2026, MEETING PREPARED ON BEHALF OF THE WORKING GROUP CHAIR, MR. PETER ONOFRE FOR REPORT AT THE APRIL 27, 2026, BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

The Working Group convened to hold elections for the 2026 Vice Chair position. The Working Group elected Michael Kennick as Vice Chair. Following the election, the Working Group received a presentation on CPS Energy's state and federal grants.

 - Pipeline & Hazardous Materials Administration (PHMSA) FY23 & FY24

 - Texas Department of Emergency Management Grid Resiliency
- B. Individual contributions to resiliency by grant type
- C. Grant alignment with CPS Energy Vision 2030 and Horizon 2050 goals

Working group members expressed appreciation for the collaboration between CPS Energy and other entities in securing grant funding, inquired about how sites are selected for certain funding, and explored the metrics used to determine program success. The working group participated in a deeper discussion around the GRIP and Grid Resiliency grants and provided feedback about the importance of engagement and collaboration with community-based non-profit organizations in executing resiliency projects.
