POWER BUNDLE

Jonathan Tijerina, Senior Director, Corporate Communications, Marketing presented an update on Power Bundle that aligns with our Flexible Path.

- Different power bundle options: Solar, Battery Storage and Natural Gas.
- A customer survey will be conducted to gauge the community's priorities for new energy solutions.
- The results will also be shared and used in messaging the community.
- CPS Energy will consider adding more generation capacity: 300-900 megawatts (MW) of solar power, 10-50 MW of energy storage solutions; and 300-500 MW of power from a natural gas unit.
