## CPS Energy and Launch SA promote programs to lower electric costs for small business owners

For business owners who take advantage of the free energy audits and implement the recommended measures, the costs to install the energy efficiency measures can be recouped in about 18 months on average.

As part of the event, Benjamin invited Gilbert de Hoyos, owner of the popular Barrio Barista Coffee on the city's Westside, for a fireside chat to share how he benefited from CPS Energy's energy assessment audit. He has changed his AC system, added vestibules to preserve heating and cooling, and now seeks to add solar panels or EV charging stations.
